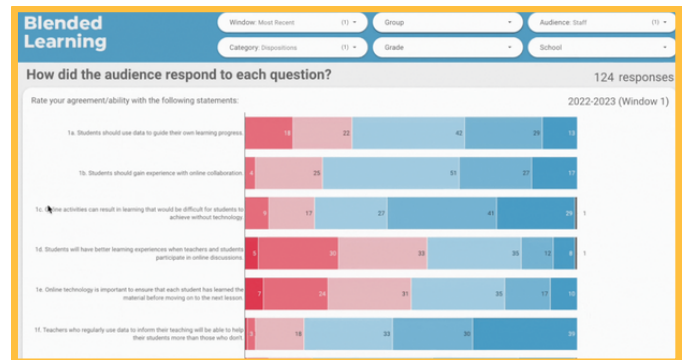


BLENDED LEARNING



Understand your teachers' current skills, practices, and attitudes about teaching in a blended learning environment. This survey asks **teacher/staff** to rate their level of agreement with beliefs and their ability to complete certain tasks.



Survey results are displayed on the dashboard in the following categories: **Dispositions, Online Integration, Data Practice, Personalizing Instruction, and Online Interactions**. Each question follows a 6-point scale: 1 = Very Low to 6 = Very High.

By viewing data in the Blended Learning Survey Dashboard, you can identify changes in opinions from each survey cycle, compare results among buildings and departments, and identify areas needing the most attention.

The sample set below comes from the Blended Learning Survey

- Students will have better learning experiences when teachers and students participate in online discussions
- Teachers should explore new teaching strategies that combine in-person and online learning.
- Decide when to use computer-based assessments (online exams, digital projects)
- Decide when it is better to interact with students in-person versus online
- Decide which groups or individual students need additional help using online assessment results
- Evaluate the effectiveness of instruction for students with disabilities using online and offline assessment results.
- Combine individual or small group instruction with educational software to help each student succeed.
- Use technology that lets each of your students adjust the speed of their learning
- Teach students how to communicate online respectfully
- Give quick online feedback to students in a variety of ways using text, audio, or video.
